#### What we know so far

#### **Visa Interview Waiver Policy and Country of Residency Changes**

- **Effective October 1, 2025**, visa interview policy waiver reduced significantly for nonimmigrant visa application
- Most individuals applying for or renewing their visas including F-1, J-1, H-1B, E-3,
  O-1 and their dependents will be required to attend an in-person interview
- Also, effective September 6, 2025 applicants for U.S. nonimmigrant visas should only schedule visa interview appointments at U.s. Embassy or Consulate in their country of nationality or residence
  - Should be able to demonstrate residence in country where applying
  - Prepare for longer wait times and more limited appointment availability

## The role of visas in eligibility for...

#### Entering the Country

• A valid visa stamp is required. This is your "ticket" for entry. Can expire in U.S. without affecting F-1 or J-1 *status*.

#### Remaining in the Country

• Must maintain F-1 or J-1 **status**. This is determined by <u>U.S. entry record (I-94)</u>, <u>valid I-20</u> <u>or DS-2019</u>, <u>and adherence to rules and regulations</u> (full time enrollment, employment with valid authorization, etc.). <u>Not</u> determined by visa stamp.

#### What we know so far

#### **Proposed Regulations on Duration of Status**

- On **August 28, 2025**, DHS/ICE proposed rule to end "duration of status" for F, J and I nonimmigrants in the Federal Register
  - **Fixed-Date Admissions**: F and J visa holders would be admitted to the U.S. for a specific end date (max 4 years), not "duration of status" (D/S); grace period reduced from 60 to 30 days.
  - **Mandatory Extension Process**: Extensions (e.g., for program changes, OPT, transfers) would require filing Form I-539 with USCIS, including a fee, biometrics, and possible interview.
  - English Language Program Limit: Students in English language training programs would be limited to 24 months of study.
  - **Restricted Academic Changes**: Limits on transferring schools or changing academic programs; graduate students cannot change their degree objective.
  - No Reverse or Lateral Study Paths: F-1 students would be prohibited from enrolling in a program at the same or lower academic level after completing one.

#### What happens next?

- Public comments on the proposal were due September 29, 2025 (15,000+ comments received)
- Comments on forms impacted by the proposal due October 27, 2025
- This is in proposed rule stage: rule would not become final until after DHS reviews public comments, submits final rule for OMB review, and then publishes a final rule in the Federal Register
- No definitive timeline of final rule publication, but some experts are predicting December 2025 or January 2026
- Dedicated ISEO workgroup in place to measure impacts and formulate plans in partnership with campus stakeholders should this go into effect

## **Academic Continuity Options**

If you are unable to get to or return to the United States, or need to leave the country:

- Communicate with your department about what academic continuity options may be right for you
- Your graduate coordinator will be a good first point of contact
- Some factors that guide the available options include:
  - Type of program (master's, MFA, PhD, etc.)
  - Progress through program
  - How much on-campus presence is needed

Unfortunately, students who are abroad are not able to be employed by the university.

## **Academic Continuity Options**

#### **Example Considerations to Guide Options:**

- Anticipated duration of the delay to return to the US. If extensive, would a <u>Leave of</u>
   <u>Absence (LOA)</u> be appropriate?
- Progress/Year in Program. If nearing completion, are there options to work with your program/advisor to accelerate your degree completion?
- Alternative Enrollment Options. Does your graduate program have "R" designation course options for remote study?
- Stage of the Quarter. Are you eligible to request an <u>Incomplete</u> from your instructor(s)?
