
SEVIS Transfers



An F-1 student may transfer their F-1 record between SEVP-certified schools. SEVIS Transfer is a way to electronically move Student and Exchange Visitor System (SEVIS) records and retain the same SEVIS identification (ID) number for the student. The SEVIS transfer process does the following:

- Sets a date (SEVIS Release Date) on which responsibility for the student's record transfers to the new school
- Ensures the student retains the same SEVIS ID number at the new school
- Helps ensure that the transfer-in school updates the student's record.

The SEVIS Transfer Process



Eligibility Criteria

In order to be eligible for a SEVIS Transfer:

- 1. Student must be in ACTIVE (or valid) F-1 status.
- 2. Last date of enrollment or last date of OPT must be within 5 months (less than 152 days) of the start of classes at the new school.
- 3. SEVIS record must be released before the end of the 60-day grace period of the student's active Form I-20.

If you are currently enrolled:

Last date of enrollment at current school

- Check the Program End Date on your most recent Form I-20
- Note that this date may be an estimate and not your actual
 Program End Date
- Ask your DSO to confirm your actual Program End Date!

Locating Your Program End Date



If you are currently on postcompletion OPT or STEM OPT:

Last date of authorized OPT as shown on current EAD card

 Check the OPT End Date ("Card Expires" date) on your current EAD card

Your Grace Period

F-1 students have **60 days following their last day of enrollment or last day of authorized OPT** to take one of several actions on their SEVIS record. These 60 days are known as the "grace period".

- Work in the U.S.
- Start a new program at your CURRENT school
- Start a new program at a NEW school
- Change Visa Status
- Depart the U.S.

Your Grace Period

F-1 students have 60 days following their last day of enrollment or last day of authorized OPT to take one of several actions on their SEVIS record. These 60 days are known as the "grace period".

- Work in the U.S.
- Start a new program at your CURRENT school
- Start a new program at a NEW school
- Change Visa Status
- Depart the U.S.

To be eligible for transfer, your SEVIS record must be released before the end of the 60-day grace period of your active Form I-20 or OPT.





Coordinating Transfer with Your Current School

The SEVIS Transfer process is NOT automatic - YOU are required to initiate and complete this process!

- > Talk to your current DSO/international student office about your plans to transfer
- What forms/documents might you need to submit with your current school to request a transfer?
- Confirm your eligibility with them: is your SEVIS record in good standing? Are you within the transfer timeline (5-month rule, 60-day grace period)?

SEVIS Release Date


To request that your current institution transfer your SEVIS record, you will need to provide your DSO/international student office with the date you want your SEVIS record released to UC San Diego. This is called your **SEVIS Release Date**.

Your DSO may help you determine this date, but it is ultimately your responsibility to request WHEN your SEVIS record gets released from your current institution to UC San Diego.


HOW TO CHOOSE YOUR SEVIS RELEASE DATE:

- Enrolled: A date within your grace period.
- **OPT:** A date within your OPT grace period, OR during your authorized OPT if the release date meets the 5-month rule.


Choosing a SEVIS Release Date (Currently Enrolled)

Requesting your UCSD Form I-20



Submitting a Request for an Immigration Document: Form I-20 (F-1) or DS-2019 (J-1)



Submit your Form I-20 or Form DS-2019 Request:

Log into <u>iServices</u> with your Student SSO (PID) or Active Directory credentials and submit only **ONE** of the following NEW ADMIT request according to visa type:

- New Admit I-20 Request if you will begin a degree program with UC San Diego in F-1 visa status.
- New Admit DS-2019 Request if you will begin a degree program with UC San Diego in <u>J-1 visa status</u>.
- New Admit: Change of Status to F-1 or J-1 Request if you will begin a degree program with UC San diego
 and are currently in the U.S. in a different non-immigrant visa status (i.e. F-2, H-4, L-2, etc.) with intention to
 apply to change to F-1 or J-1 status with USCIS without departing the U.S., schedule an appointment with an
 ISEO advisor before submitting this form. If you are in the U.S. and wish to change your non-immigrant visa
 status to F-1 or J-1 by travel, do not use this request.

Remember to complete all required eForms when submitting your New Admit Request. You can view the status of your New Admit request under the "Requests" section of the iServices Home Page. When you have successfully submitted a request, the status of your request will be "Pending Office Approval."

Deadline to Submit & Processing Time

<u>iServices.ucsd.edu</u> will open on **MONDAY, MARCH 3, 2025**, for newly admitted Summer and Fall 2025 international students to begin requesting their immigration documents.

When does your program begin?	Deadline to request Form I-20/DS-2019*	
Before August 1	Submit your iServices request by May 1	
Between August 1 and September 23	Submit your iServices request by June 1	
On September 22 (Fall 2025 quarter start)	Submit your iServices request by August 1	

^{*}Requests for immigration documents will be accepted and processed after August 1; however, to ensure timely issuance, you are urged to submit your request by the relevant deadline above.

SEVIS Transfer Eligibility

(*) Information Required

If you are within yout 60 day grace period or on OPT/STEM OPT, you may be eligible to request a transfer of your SEVIS Record to UC San Diego.

Prepare for your Application

- Review the FAQs on Transferring your SEVIS Record to UC San Diego.
- Consult with your International Student Advisor at your current U.S. school regarding SEVIS Transfer eligibility.

If you have been admitted to a new program at another institution in the United States, you may be eligible to request a transfer of your SEVIS Record.

The SEVIS Transfer Process



"Transfer Pending" Period

Once you receive your "Transfer Pending" Form I-20 from UC San Diego:

- ➤ Review it to make sure all of the information is correct, and that your SEVIS ID number matches the SEVIS ID on your previous I-20 from your prior institution
- ➤ You may enroll in courses (check with your college or academic department). You are expected to enroll full-time in-person by your Form I-20 Program Start Date
- ➤ You are required to report any changes to ISEO through the iServices *New Admit Updated I-20 Request* to maintain your Form I-20
- You may apply for on-campus employment
- > You may travel/re-enter the U.S. (you are not subject to the 30-day rule)
- ➤ You may use your new I-20 to apply for/renew an F-1 visa from abroad

Completing Your SEVIS Transfer

Important!

REQUIRED: Check-In with ISEO within 10 days of US arrival




Within 10 days after arrival into the USA, take the following steps:

- Check-In for I-20/DS-2019 Activation: Once you arrive to the U.S., you must submit the <u>Check-In for I-20/DS-2019 Activationn form</u> in order for ISEO to activate your F or J status.
- Document iSelfCheck: Complete the <u>International Student Document iSelfCheck</u>. It is important for you to review and verify that your documents were processed correctly at the port of entry.
 - Please note that there is no need to notify ISEO when you complete the document self-check unless you have questions or if you believe there is an error in your visa status.
 - You should fulfill the document self-check requirement every time that you re-enter the U.S.

Starting Monday, March 3 at 9AM PT: Request Your Form I-20 or DS-2019 via iServices

International students requiring F-1 or J-1 student visa status to study in the US must request and receive a Form I-20 (F-1) or Form DS-2019 (J-1) from ISEO via **iServices**. iServices is ISEO's document request system. These forms from UC San Diego are required for all newly admitted F-1 or J-1 students, even if you are transferring from another US school!

iServices Opens: Monday, March 3 at 9AM PT

iServices will open for newly admitted international students to request their Form I-20 or DS-2019 on March 3. In preparation to submit the request for your Form I-20 or DS-2019, please review the important information below:



- In order to access iServices when it opens, you must have accepted your offer of admission and have <u>set up</u> all required UC San Diego student accounts.
- Review the STEP 1: Apply for your F-1 or J-1
 Status instructions on our <u>iNewStudent website</u> so that
 you can prepare the required documents and information
 ahead of time.
- If you are experiencing technical difficulties with iServices, please see review <u>iServices Instructions</u>. If the problem persists, please see <u>iServices Troubleshooting</u>.
