## **Academic Internship Program**

Students can earn general elective academic credit for an internship through our AIP 97 or AIP 197 courses.






In addition, AIP also has several special programs and partnerships, including:


- Biology Research Internship Program BISP

## URH Programs for Undergraduate Students

- TRELS: Triton Research and Experiential Learning Scholars (TRELS) are awarded \$1,000 for work on their project in the quarter in which they are awarded (winter or spring). You'll use the funds for research, guided artistic or creative projects, or public service opportunities, under the guidance of a UC San Diego faculty member.
- FMP: The Faculty Mentor Program (FMP) allows students with at least sophomore standing (45+ units) to work as a research assistants to a UC San Diego faculty member for at least 10 hours per week during the academic year; participate in a research project; receive 4 units of independent study credit each quarter
- UC Scholars: The UC Scholars Program is an 8week, full-time summer research experience for undergraduates, supported by UC San Diego's Office of Student Affairs and the Undergraduate Research Hub.





# Jacobs Cooperative Education Pilot Program










## Jacobs Cooperative Education Pilot Program

- Part of the Jacobs School of Engineering Corporate Affiliates Program (CAP)
- Co-ops (& internships) posted in the Jacobs School Job & Internship Portal
- Students must meet with their major academic advisor to review their course plan and obtain clearance
- Start work in Summer (June/July), end in December
  - Full-time (30-40 hours per week) for up to 6 months
- Recruitment timeline:
  - Fall or between January-March 2025
- Most Jacobs School of Engineering Majors eligible

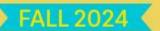
















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## **OASIS LATS**

- Professional Development and Study Skills Workshops












## **Preparing Your Application**

#### **Faculty Mentor Program**

#### Application Period: October 28, 2024-January 17, 2025

There are 4 items required to apply to FMP:

#### 1. Applications

- General Application and Undergraduate Application (When you finish the general application, you will be automatically directed to complete the undergraduate application.)
- FMP Application (After you finish the previous two applications, you will given the opportunity to choose to complete the FMP application.)

#### 2. Research proposal (as part of the FMP application)

Provide a brief description of the project and/or research activities you plan to conduct under the guidance of
your faculty mentor. If possible, elaborate on what type(s) of research methodologies you will be conducting
(e.g. library/archival research, clinical research, fieldwork, bench work, etc.) and how you plan on maintaining
contact with your mentor. (350 words max)

#### 3. Transcripts

- If you are an incoming transfer student (You do not have a UC San Diego GPA):
  - A copy of your unofficial transcript(s) from previous school(s) (community colleges, other universities, etc.)
- · If you have attended UC San Diego for at least 1 quarter:
  - A copy of your unofficial UC San Diego transcript (How to download your transcript)
  - If you completed coursework prior to attending UC San Diego (e.g., transfer credits), they will appear on your UC San Diego transcript. You do not need to upload transfer transcripts.


#### 4. Mentor name and contact information

- Don't wait! Students should find a mentor and discuss a potential research project before adding that faculty
  member's name and email to the FMP application.
- Students are responsible for finding and contacting their own mentor, but the FMP coordinator can help if
  you're having a hard time. For tips, review <u>our page on how to find a mentor</u>. Start looking for a mentor as
  you're filling out the general application—be proactive!
- Once you save your faculty mentor's information in the application, an email is automatically sent to that
  person asking them to agree a number of statements with regards to their support to mentor you in FMP.
   (NOT a formal letter of recommendation.)
- The faculty mentor needs to complete this section before the application deadline.

## Reaching Out to Professors

# With any professional emails, you want to consider:

#### **Clarity**

Be clear about what you're asking or saying

#### **Know Your Audience**


Who are you emailing exactly? What are you emailing that person? What is the context around that person?

#### **Gratitude**

Show that you appreciate their time and effort. Show that you understand the dynamic of the relationship





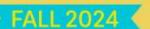
