Overview of Advising



- The role of advisors is to provide information and present options, but ultimately students make the decisions
- There are many types of advisors at UC San Diego:
 - College Academic Advisors
 - Major or Department Advisors
 - ISEO Advisors
 - NOTE: You need to speak to your international student advisor before considering dropping below
 12 units; NOT college advisors
 - Student Organization Advisors
- Each advisor plays a slightly different role
- There is a difference between your College Advisor, Major Advisor & International Advisor Check your plans with all three advisors before making an academic change!

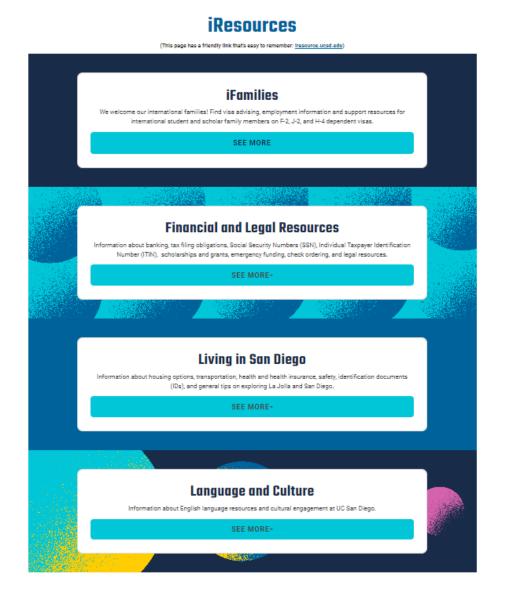

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT SERVICES

Content Tutoring (CT)

Focus of a Content Tutoring Appointment:

- Develop problem-solving skills to better comprehend course material
 - O Tutees are expected to come prepared to ask tutors specific questions. Tutors will not provide student answers or do the work for them but redirect questions to engage in critical thinking of content.

- Biology (BILD 1-3, BIBC 100 & 102, BIPN 100, and BIMM 100)
- Chemistry (CHEM 6A-C, 40A-C, 41A-C)
- Economics (ECON 1, 3)

- Physics (PHYS 1A-C, 2A-C)
- Statistics (PSYC 60 and MATH 11)

WRITING SERVICES

Undergraduate Services

Trained peer writing consultants offer **one-on-one** writing support to discuss your:

- writing assignments from your College Writing Program
- writing projects from capstones or other classes
- writing for non-class projects: graduate school applications, cover letters, study abroad and other scholarship applications, and more

Meet face to face in Geisel Library or online.

What can you expect from a writing consultation?

- Engage in a conversation about your work with a curious reader who wants you to succeed
- Discover how an interested reader reacts to your writing and what questions they have about the way you think through an assignment
- Delve deeper into writing as a process, not just a product, through a conversation that helps bridge the gap(s) between your thinking and writing for an audience
- Develop writing and revision strategies that can be applied to future assignments and projects

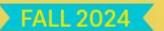

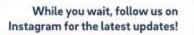






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Understanding Academic Integrity at UC San Diego









Academic Integrity

The courage to be honest, respectful, responsible, fair & trustworthy even when it is difficult to do so.



Why does INTEGRITY matter?

Academic Integrity



Maintain the value of a UCSD degree
Fairness and equity for all
Cheating hurts your sense of self

Examples of Academic Integrity Violations



- Completing an academic assignment with other people without permission.
- Using sources without citations.
- Copying another student's assignment, in part or in total, and submitting it as your own work.
- Copying your online quiz or assignment answers from the internet or from anyone.
- Paying or asking anyone to create (in part or completely) an assignment for you.
- Using a tool that you have not been told you can use: a translator,
 ChatGPT, a friend, a website

Challenges to Choosing Integrity



- Stress including challenges in school, personal life, current circumstances
- High expectations / Pressure to succeed
- There are opportunities
- Focusing on grades instead of learning
- Lack of belief in yourself and your abilities
- Perceiving or observing peers to be cheating
- Poor time management
- Perceptions about a class or instructor
- Not understanding or agreeing with the rules, expectations, etc.
- Justifications
- Failure to engage in ethical reasoning

Consequences to Acting without Integrity NEW INTERNATIONAL STUDENT

- Can affect your GPA or ability to enroll*
- Failing an assignment or course*
- Probation, suspension, or dismissal*
- Can affect what you learn
- Affects other people; more than just you

*If any of these things happen, talk to ISEO

You can Choose Integrity!



- Know the rules and standards (and if you don't, ask!)
- Understand what is considered an AI violation (and what the consequences are)
- Seek help/Use reliable on-campus resources (successful students ask for help!)
- Reduce temptation (ie. manage your time)
- Remember that you earned your place at UCSD you belong here, we are lucky to have you here!
- Don't forget why you came to UCSD
- Think about what matters to you most (beyond this stressful moment)
- Don't be a bystander act when you see something unethical happening (or about to happen!)

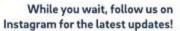




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Why getting involved is important
